Foreword

The following list of Classical sources used by Writers on Atlantis and cognate subjects is, admittedly, incomplete, owing to its having been compiled while on war service in Iran, Egypt and Italy.

It is nevertheless, submitted in the hope that will bring forth enough constructive criticism to enable a revised and complete edition to be produced.

It should be explained that this list of Classical sources, is but part of a large scheme, that of bringing up to date and republishing the Bibliography of Atlantis issued by Gattefosse and Roux at Lyons (France) in 1926, a work which has proved the trusted standby of practically every writer on Atlantis since that time.

Unfortunately progress has been slow, as the author's extensive library of Atlantean writings is scattered over various parts of the world and cannot be reassembled until he returns to England.

It is hoped that a brief bibliography of writings between the end of the Classical period and the discovery of America by Columbus, will be available by the autumn of 1947.

In the meantime any information regarding new books, articles in the press, privately circulated papers, or MSS awaiting publication, referring directly to Atlantis or Lemuria, would be much appreciated.
